THE PROBLEM OF EVIL

- An All-Powerful God would be able to destroy evil
- An All-Loving God would want to destroy evil
- Evil exists
- Therefore an All-Powerful and All-Loving God does not exist

THE FREE WILL RESPONSE

- An all-loving God gives the gift of free will
- An all-powerful God cannot give love and take it away
- God cannot do what is logically contradicting.



"If you choose to say "God can give a creature free will and at the same time withhold free will from it," you have not succeeded in saying anything about God: meaningless combinations of words do not suddenly acquire meaning simply because we prefix to them the two other words "God can."


IS GOD THE CREATOR OF EVIL?

- "Evil is not a divine creation, but rather a term created by humanity in our attempt to explain the deprivation of good." St Thomas Aquinas



Is Evil Only a Problem for Christians?

EVIL IS EVERYONE'S PROBLEM

- Every world religion must provide a diagnosis and a solution to the problem of evil and suffering.
- The answer must meet both the intellectual and the emotional demands of the question.



BIGGER PROBLEM FOR ATHEISTS

- Every judgment presupposes a standard.
- What is their standard for judging evil to be evil?

The Greater Good – Our Limited Perspective


"And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose." Rom 8:28

An all-knowing God

knows the end of all things.

An all-loving God

wants to bring all things to good end

An all-powerful God

can bring all things to a good end

Therefore

all things will come to a good end.

I don't know the purpose for some evil, but I know why I don't know.

Why do bad things happen to good people?

THREE QUESTIONABLE ASSUMPTIONS

- Who is to say that we are good people?
- Who is to say that all suffering is bad?
- Who is to say that we must know God's reasons?

What about the death of a Child?

CHRISTIAN RESPONSE

- God created the child's life; He has the power to restore that life again. (John 11:21-26)
- When a child dies he/she goes to Heaven. (Phil 1:21-24)
- God gives comfort to the family who lost the child. (Psalm 23)
- Separation caused by death is only temporary (1Thes 4:13-18)

PARTAKERS OF CHRIST'S SUFFERING

- 1Pe 4:12-13 "Beloved, do not think it strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened to you; but rejoice to the extent that you partake of Christ's sufferings, that when His glory is revealed, you may also be glad with exceeding joy."
- Rom 8:17 "If indeed we suffer with Him, that we may also be glorified together."

Christ Suffers With Me

SURRENDER AND BE COMFORTED

- Christ did not suffer to take away our sufferings but to take away our sins. He transformed our sufferings and made it fellowship with His (Phi 3:10).
- He comes to us and says take my hand and trust in Me. My hand has more nail marks in it than yours ever will.
- I alone can comfort your aching heart. Surrender and be comforted!

WHAT DO YOU NEED MOST IN SUFFERING?

- Someone who had gone through similar suffering to come and sit with me
- Their mere presence provides the greatest comfort




He provides the <u>solution</u> to the problem of evil and an <u>explanation</u> to the mystery of suffering

CHRIST'S SOLUTION TO SUFFERING

- He came to us, wept and suffered
 - Transforming the meaning of suffering
- He died on the cross
 - Transforming the meaning of death
- He rose from the dead
 - Transforming the meaning of life


The Story Continues

- Our personal pleasure, is the most important thing in life.




- Do you know what kind of person thinks that way?

Blessings of Suffering

1. DISPLAYS GOD'S GLORY

- Joh 11:4 "When Jesus heard that, He said, this sickness is not unto death, but for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it."
- Joh 9:2-3 "His disciples asked Him, saying, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" Jesus answered, "Neither this man nor his parents sinned, but that the works of God should be revealed in him.

"Jesus saw that in the end, Lazarus's illness and death would be for the glory of God. This is not to say that the sickness came on Lazarus so that God should be glorified, for it would be silly to say this, but rather, since the sickness had come upon Lazarus, Jesus foresaw the wonderful conclusion to Lazarus's illness."

2. REFINES OUR FAITH

- 1Pe 1:7 "...you have been grieved by various trials, that the genuineness of your faith.. though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory."
- Ps. 66:10 "For You, O God, have tested us; You have refined us as silver is refined."
- Jam. 1:2-4 "Count it all joy when you fall into various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience."

"Suffering is a real bond, an encouragement to greater love, and the basis of spiritual perfection and godliness. Everywhere you see suffering being praised, everywhere it is accepted as necessary for us. For in the world there is no one who wins a trophy without suffering, who has not strengthened himself with labors and dieting and exercise and vigils and many other things like that."



3. HELPS US SYMPATHIZE WITH OTHERS

2Co 1:3-5 "...God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort those who are in any trouble, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God. For as the sufferings of Christ abound in us, so our consolation also abounds through Christ. Now if we are afflicted, it is for your consolation and salvation, which is effective for enduring the same sufferings which we also suffer."

"You have one deficiency but not another. The neighbor's case is the opposite. He has another deficit but not the one you have. You must bear his and he yours. For thus is the law of love fulfilled." - St Theodore



4. FOCUSES OUR EYES ON HEAVEN

- 2Co 4:17-18 "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory, while we do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen are temporary, but the things which are not seen are eternal."
- Rom 8:18 "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us."

"There is nothing which is worthy of comparison with the future glory. For how can what is mortal be compared to what is immortal, what is visible to what is invisible, what is temporal to what is eternal or what is perishable to what is everlasting?"



5. KEEPS US HUMBLE, NEEDING GOD

 2Co 12:7-9 "And lest I should be exalted above measure by the abundance of the revelations, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, a messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I be exalted above measure. Concerning this thing I pleaded with the Lord three times that it might depart from me. And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me."

6. DRIVES US TO REPENTANCE

- 2Co 7:10 "For godly sorrow produces repentance leading to salvation, not to be regretted; but the sorrow of the world produces death."
- 1Pe 4:1 "Therefore, since Christ suffered for us in the flesh, arm yourselves also with the same mind, for he who has suffered in the flesh has ceased from sin"

"Sin produced pain, and through pain sin is annihilated. God tells Eve: "You shall bring forth children in pain." (Gen 3:16.) And he showed pain as the harvest of sin. However, oh, how great He is! That which he gave for punishment he changed to salvation. Sin gave birth to pain; pain destroys sin. Just as a worm that is born by a tree consumes the very same tree, likewise pain, which is born by sin, kills sin when it is supplied by repentance. Pain is good for those who repent sincerely."

7. REVEALS OUR TRUE CHARACTER

 Job 36:15 "He delivers the afflicted by their affliction and opens their ear by adversity."

Heb 12:5-11 "My son, despise not the chastening of the Lord, nor be discouraged when you are rebuked by Him; for who the Lord loves He chastens, and scourges every son whom He receives. If you endure chastening, God deals with you as with sons; for what son is there whom a father does not chasten? ... For they indeed for a few days chastened us as seemed best to them, but He for our profit, that we may be partakers of His holiness. Now no chastening seems to be joyful for the present, but painful; nevertheless, afterward it yields the peaceable fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it."

- 1. Display God's glory
- 2. Refine our faith
- 3. Help us sympathize with others
- 4. Focuses our eyes on heaven
- 5. Keep us humble, in need of God
- 6. Drive us to repentance
- 7. Reveal our true character

Final Words
